

ADMINISTERING MEDICATION(S) AT SCHOOL

For any student who may require medication during the school day, whether it is prescription or over the counter, an Authorization and Directions for Administering Medication(s) at School form must be completed and sent in to the main office with the child's medication. This could be if a student requires a puffer during the day or even an antibiotic for a period of time. Some students may also occasionally need Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen. These medications must always be kept in the office and be administered in the office by staff. Should you need an Authorization and Directions for Administering Medication(s) at School form, you can find one on our website under the Students and Families Section under the Help heading.

SCHOOLCASH ONLINE

Colby Village Elementary has moved toward having most items paid for through SchoolCash Online. This system allows you to make payments electronically with the click of a button. You will be able to make all payments safely, securely, and quickly through **SchoolCash Online**.

Our school will post items for purchase and assign school fees relevant to your child. You can make all purchases and payments from your phone, tablet, or computer. If you have not already done so, we would like families to register as soon as possible.

To get started, please register for **SchoolCash Online**. It's free and takes less than two minutes. Once you are registered, you will receive an email once items are posted for purchase. PARKING LOT SAFETY

Please do not drive or park in parking lot to drop off or pick up students for school or Excel. Our driveway and parking areas are for the use of <u>busses and staff only</u>. Please let any caregivers know (grandparents, aunt and uncles, etc) that they should not enter the parking lot.

HEAD LICE POLICY

Head lice are tiny insects that live on the head. They lay eggs (called nits) close to the scalp. Head lice do not spread disease, and having head lice does not mean that you are not clean. Head lice are very common among children. Scratching the head can be a sign of head lice, but you can have headlice without any itching.

Once a child has been treated with the appropriate product to kill the lice, they are able to return to school. A second treatment is necessary after 9 to 10 days. Daily lice combing is required between the 1st and second treatment to ensure no new lice are able to hatch.

Tuesday, October 7th is picture day with the retake day on Monday, October 20th.




SAFEARRIVAL BY SCHOOLMESSENGER

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive to school safely each day. Parents/guardians of students who attend our school now have the option to report their child's absence in advance using a toll-free number, the PowerSchool Parent Portal or the SchoolMessenger app!

SchoolMessenger SafeArrival – an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for families to inform their child's school if they will be away – powers all three of these options.
