OUT OF AREA REQUESTS

Parents/guardians may seek placement for their child in a school outside of the neighbourhood in which they reside under the guidelines of the <u>Student Registration Policy</u>.

The Out-of-Area request process for the 2024-25 school year begins on April 2, 2024 at 8:00 a.m. You can find the online registration by clicking: https://www.hrce.ca/families/student-registration/out-area-request

The electronic submission will be sent automatically to the receiving school and will include a date and time stamp. Requests for students who will have older siblings in the receiving school in September will be given priority for an Out-of-Area placement if adequate accommodation is available.



PARKING LOT SAFETY

Parents/guardians are continuing to enter the school parking lot. Please do not drive or park in parking lot to drop-off or pick up students at any time during the day. This <u>includes Excel</u> before and after school. Our driveway and parking areas are for the use of busses and staff only.



Please let any caregivers know (grandparents, aunt and uncles, etc) that they should not enter the parking lot.

We limit traffic as a way to promote safety for all of our students.

PREPARING FOR THE SOLAR ECLIPSE

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development is pleased to provide all students in Nova Scotia with eclipse glasses to view the upcoming solar eclipse safely. These glasses will be sent home with students closer to the April 8th date.

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes between the Earth and the sun, obscuring the view of the sun from a section of the Earth. This event is extremely rare, with the next solar eclipse not occurring in the province until 2079. Nova Scotia will be just outside of the zone of totality for the solar eclipse; for this reason, it is important that individuals have appropriate protection to view this historic event.

The solar eclipse will begin at 3:27 p.m., reaching maximum coverage at 4:38 p.m., and ending at 5:44 p.m.
